Dear South Central Skiers:

The year 1975 marks the twenty-fifth anniversary of the South Central Region. Logically, there should be little more importance attached to a 25th anniversary than a 24th and possibly a little less than to a 26th, but there is a certain appeal to the imagination in decades and quarter centuries, and the South Central Region may as well take advantage of it.

Ten years ago the South Central Region had only six sanction tournaments. Scheduled for 1975 there are fourteen sanction tournaments, five novice tournaments, one ski show tournament, at least one kite tournament, not to mention the birth of the intercollegiate circuit. It is literally a problem for clubs to find a weekend to host a tournament that does not conflict with other clubs. Our membership has climbed from only 600 to over 1200 in the past five years. In only three years the tournament skiers have increased from 177 to over 300.

I hope that the introduction of this tournament guide will indicate that the South Central Region is not ready to sit idle and let the progress of the sport pass it by.

The accomplishments of the past years are due in great measure to the efforts of our national committeemen, Regional councilmen, officers and National Directors. It is for their dedicated cooperation and support, that I dedicate the first tournament guide and extend my thanks and appreciation.

THE SOUTH-CENTRAL REGION 25 YEARS

In 1950 the South-Central Region was recognized by the American Water Ski Association as part of a five region division of the 50 states.

The states that made up the SCR were: Louisiana, Texas, Oklahoma, Mississippi, Arkansas. Later the state of New Mexico was added.

Where was the first South-Central Region Water Ski Tournament? Could it have been on Lake Murray in Ardmore, Oklahoma, on August 19, 1951, under the leadership of Gordon Leaman, who was referred to as Regional Vice President?

The only source for information is the "Water Skier." The first issue being published in October, 1951.

The next three South-Central Tournaments were held at the same location with the 1954 meet referred to for the first time as a "Regional" competition.

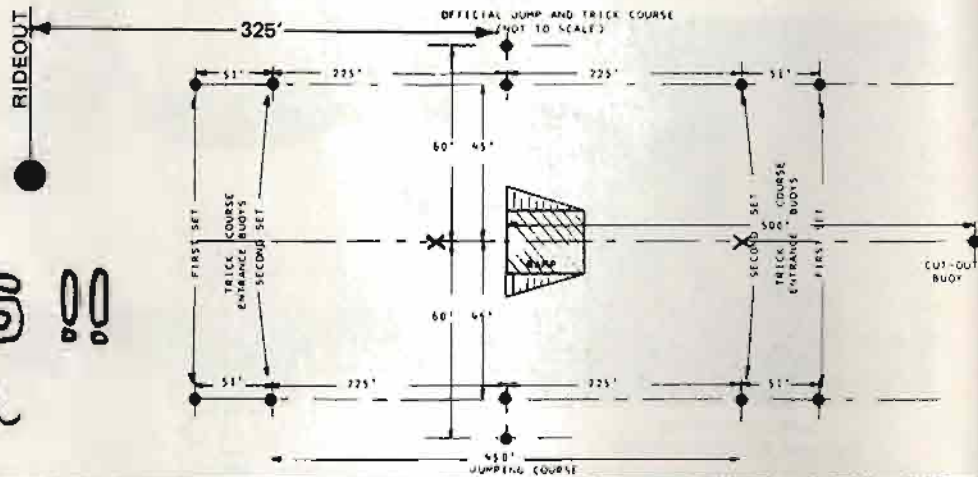

SAFETY IN WATER SKIING

With common sense precautions and attention to five areas of safety consciousness, any out-of-doors enthusiast can enjoy skiing.

By H. STEWART McDONALD

Drawing on his 15 years experience as an expert water skier, H. Stewart McDonald has outlined some basic and sensible safety pointers on the sport. The writer owns and operates his own ski school in Tampa, Fla., and is a former mixed doubles champion.

Water skiing is safe. This simple statement of truth is probably the best direct approach to "Safety In Water Skiing." Of course, it must be qualified by saying that, like any sport or activity in our modern life, the degree of safety is relative to the precautions and care that are taken by its participants.

Annual surveys of the Outboard Boating Club of America and the American Water Ski Association

show conclusively that, even though an estimated 500,000 pairs of water skis are sold annually in the U.S.A., accidents and fatalities have been low. While water skiing has become the third major incentive for people to buy boats, serious or fatal accidents on skis represent a surprisingly small percentage of the relatively small number of total boating accidents and fatalities. In fact, accidents from both cruising and fishing, e.g., collisions, falling overboard, capsizing, etc., are larger in both numbers and percentages than those of skiing.

Still, let's not avoid the wake of facts. There can be and have been accidents and fatalities as a direct result of water skiing. Like all accidents, be they on the job, at home, in the car or on the water, they can be avoided by learning and respecting certain safety precautions.
