Regional and National News

The ABC SKI MITES of North Carolina has issued a challenge to other AWSA ski clubs—The Ski Mites say they will raise and donate more funds for the U.S. Team Auction than any other club, and furthermore, the clubs of the State of North Carolina combined will out-donate any other state in the Union—ANY CHALLENGERS FROM THE SOUTH-CENTRAL REGION????

National contestants, in addition to the rating requirements, must have competed in the corresponding event at the Regionals in the region of their residence. There will be NO provision for waiving this requirement. See Rule 4.07 and 4.08.

At the Nationals, only first place ties will be run off.

Trick release person may release skier in place of throwing the handle. This will count the same as if the skier threw the handle. Same requirements.

Rope handle attachment, at Record Tournaments, will have tolerance of plus or minus 1 inch instead of 2 inches.

Slalom courses for Record Capability will have to comply with World requirements, as for dimensions and tolerances.

New skiers ratings, mostly increased requirements, will be effective at this years 1981 Nationals.

New procedures for Sanction forms is in effect. E.V.P.'s will not have forms. They must be obtained from A.W.S.A. Headquarters. The completed form must be returned to A.W.S.A. Headquarters directly, NOT TO THE E.V.P. Do not return them to me as this will only take additional time which you may need if you are pushing the 21 day deadline. There was a general mailing to all clubs or sponsors of last years tournaments. If you have not received forms at this date, contact Headquarters, not the E.V.P.

Rule 13 Exception: At the option of the sponsoring club, the skier may be allowed to start on an 18.25 meter line at below maximum speed. When the maximum speed is reached, if the skier makes a perfect pass, he receives credit for both the long line and the short line pass. If the pass is missed, he will receive credit for buoys as if it were the long line pass.

CONFEDERATE SKIERS (Florence, MS) - When Lake

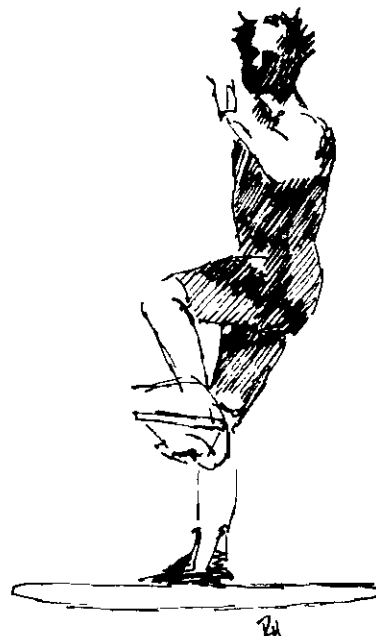

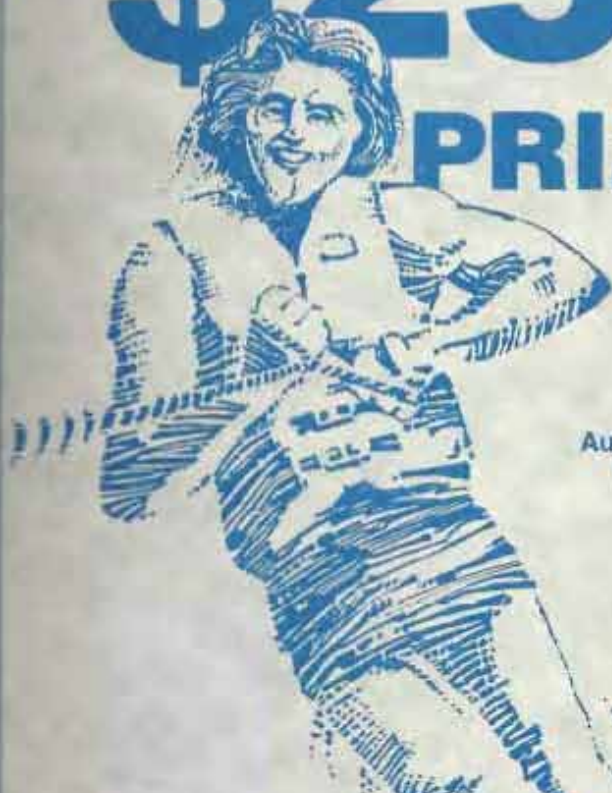
